I deal with double and single yellow line restrictions, school zig zags, solid white lines etc. across a number of our roads and I am keen to enforce for everyone's safety. Visits to places of faith a visit attractions are also attended.

Speed enforcement was carried out on Halebank Road on the following dates and times

01st February 2023 from 0909 to 1330hrs with 9 activations – highest 41mph and 13th February 2023 from 1630 to 1715hrs with no activations.

Very pleased to report the Halebank Business District (the bid) overseen by the Halton Chamber have been given a new five year term by most of the businesses in the Halebank areas of Pickering's Road, MerseyView Road and Foundry Lane. On a similar note I am dealing with a number of HGV's which have been left parked up on Pickering's Road for numerous weeks now. I am being assisted with this matter by the Driver and Vehicle Standards Agency.

I have also requested the double yellow No Waiting restrictions are repainted.

Visits have been made to the public houses, Places of faith and schools. Farms and farmers are checked along with businesses.
